Course Description: The content of this course focuses on areas of second language research regarding learner differences that have an immediate impact on teacher practices. We will focus on aspects of cognition (aptitude, working memory, multiple intelligences), motivation, affective (anxiety) and personality (beliefs) factors that can affect learning with the goal of helping teachers explore their learners and their practices in relation to each of these areas.

Course Objectives: After completing this course, students will have a better understanding of factors influencing their students' learning. They will be aware of ways in which they can adjust their practices in relation to these factors in order to positively influence learning. And in exploring one aspect of their practice and their students' learning in more detail, they will gain greater control over the their ability to research, write, and share about their practices.
